**SUMMARY:** This election study was carried out in three separate phases: March 18-25, April 26-May 5, and May 27-June 6 of 1981. The study investigated attitudes on Israel's national agenda, party stances, a voter model for the ideal political party, reasons for voter apathy, and the extent to which voters can influence political decisions. Background information on respondents includes age, gender, education, political orientation, marital/family status, employment status, social class, number of people in household, adherence to religious tradition, characteristics of place of residence, length of time as an Israeli resident, monthly household expenses, and contact with media sources.

**SAMPLING:** Representative sample of the population of Israel in 1981.

**NOTE:** (1) The fieldwork was carried out by Dahaf (March and May) and by the Israeli Institute for Applied Social Research (April). (2) This collection has not been processed by ICPSR staff. ICPSR is distributing the data and documentation for this collection in essentially the same form in which they were received. When appropriate, documentation has been converted to Portable Document Format (PDF), data files have been converted to non-platform-specific formats, and variables have been recoded to ensure respondents' anonymity. (3) The data collection instrument, including frequencies, is provided as a Portable Document Format (PDF) file. The PDF file format was developed by Adobe Systems Incorporated and can be accessed using PDF reader software, such as the Adobe Acrobat Reader. Information on how to obtain a copy of the Acrobat Reader is provided on the ICPSR Website.

Elections Study 1981

The Israel Election Study of 1981 was conducted in three phases, each based on a representative sample of the adult, Jewish population.

The first phase was held between 18-25 March 1981 and included 1249 respondents. The second phase, held between 26 April - 4 May 1981, was based on a sample of 1088 interviewees, and the third and final phase, held between 27 May - 6 June 1981, included 1237 respondents.

The findings of the three phases are organized according to the structure of the three questionnaires. The questionnaires present questions and the possible answers - the numbers that appears to the left of each question indicate the punch card positions. The numbers to the right of the answers indicate the percentage distribution of each question. In the March and May surveys the total of percentages for each question is less than 100% - the remainder is the percentage of interviewees who did not respond to the question. In the April survey, the percentage that did not respond is indicated below the distribution according to the answers for each question.

The field research was conducted by "Dahaf" (March and May) and by the Israeli Institute for Applied Social Research (April). The questionnaires were compiled by Prof. Asher Arian of the Political Science Department, Tel-Aviv University, and are presented and made available as part of the activity of the Romulo Betancourt Chair of Political Science at Tel Aviv University.
