ICPR PROCESSING NOTES

This study is being released as a class III study. The codebook is described by the original investigator on pages i and ii. The data for this study are contained in three datasets, one dataset for each of the three phases. In addition to the variables described in the codebook, the following ID variables are included on each deck:

RESPONDENT ID NUMBER FOR PHASES I, II, III

COL. 1-4 of each deck.

DECK ID NUMBER FOR PHASES I, II, III

COL. 78 of each deck.

PHASE ID NUMBER

COL. 79-80 of each deck.

Phases II and III of this study were carried out in conjunction with other projects underway at the Israel Institute of Applied Social Research at the time. The data collected from these other projects are in the datasets but documentation is not provided for them nor does the ICPR possess documentation for them.

The number of variables in each of the three data sets is not the same. The PHASE I dataset consists of 3 decks and 177 variables; the PHASE II dataset consists of 4 decks and 118 variables; and the PHASE III dataset consists of 4 decks and 76 variables.

The following processing steps have been carried out.

1. The data have been sorted and all data decks are present and in ascending order by respondent ID.
2. Undocumented codes have been identified, and where possible the correct documentation has been added to the codebook. Codes which we were not able to document are listed in the codebook as undocumented codes.

3. When this study was keypunched blanks were sometimes used in place of zeroes. These blanks have been replaced by zeroes such that the datasets do not now contain any blanks in data columns.
4. Univariate frequencies have been taken for all of the variables in the study and may be found at the end of the codebook. The percentages found in the codebook are those of the original investigator and have not been checked by the processor.

The Israel Election Study of 1969 was conducted in three phases; for each phase a representative sample of the urban adult Jewish population was selected. Phase 1 was conducted in August 1969 and included 380 respondents. Phase 2, conducted in September-October 1969, had 1314 respondents. Phase 3, conducted before and after the elections (October 28, 1969) during October, November and December 1969, included 1825 respondents.

The research project resulted from the cooperation of Tel Aviv University, the Hebrew University and the Israel Institute for Applied Social Research. Phase 3 was conducted as part of the Continuing Surveys of the Israel Institute for Applied Social Research and the Communications Institute of the Hebrew University.

The research project was conducted by Alan Arian, Michael Gurevitch, Emanuel Gutmann and Louisa Guttman.

All findings here appear in percentages. In order to facilitate the reading of the codebook, the questions were rearranged into four sections: (a) background variables - pages 1 - 14; (b) political attitudes, voting and participation - pages 15 - 64; (c) general issues - pages 65 - 94; and (d) the interview - pages 95- 97.

The following rules have been used in preparing this codebook:

To the left of each question, the phase and punch card position of each question is noted. For example, to the left of the question "Where were you born?" the following notation is found: Phase 1 - 3/55

Phase 2 - 4/15

Phase 3 - 3/46

This means that in phase 1 the appropriate answer to the question appears in card 3, column 55 and in phase 2, the answer appears in card 4, column 15 etc. If the question was not asked in one of the phases, the sign (-) is used.

After the question, the legal answers appear, with the appropriate punch noted to the left in parentheses. For example, the answers to the previous question are

(0) No answer

(1) Israel

(2) Central and Eastern Europe ... etc.

That is, a respondent of phase 1 who did not answer this question, would have a 0 punch in column 55 of his card 3. In a small number of cases, the same answer will have a different punch-code in the different phases. For example, the "no answer" response might be coded "0" in phase 1 and "8" in phase 2. In those cases, the number (8) in parentheses will appear before the percentage of the appropriate phase.

Occasionally, some categories have been collapsed and reported accordingly. For example, in the question relating to respondent's age, the 30-34 and 35-39 categories have been collapsed and they appear as follows:

The percentage which corresponds to these categories is the sum of these two categories. On the punched cards the original data are, of course, preserved.

APPENDIX IITHE SAMPLE

Three separate samples were interviewed during the summer and fall of 1969 and the analysis of their responses makes up the bulk of this book. Each sample was representative of the urban adult Jewish population and was drawn from the Voters' List of the Interior Ministry. Drawing the samples and conducting the interviews was done by the Israel Institute of Applied Social Research, headed by Louis Guttman.

The first sample was interviewed in August and included 380 completed interviews. The second phase was conducted in September and October and included 1315 completed interviews. In the third phase, conducted in October and November, 1825 individuals were interviewed. The third phase was carried out as part of the Continuing Surveys of the Israel Institute of Applied Social Research and the Institute of Communications of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, the latter headed by Elihu Katz.

As is clear from Appendix I, the number of questions asked regarding the elections decreased from phase to phase. The selection of questions for the succeeding phase was determined by preliminary analyses of the responses received in the preceding phase and by time and budget limitations.

The dropout rate was about 46 per cent from the original samples. One of the major classes of reasons for the dropout rate related to locating the potential respondent. In phase 2, 47 per cent of the dropouts were because of address unknown, address not found, unknown at given address and not found at home after three visits. In phase 3, these reasons accounted for 41 per cent of the dropout rate. Language difficulties (including illiteracy and not speaking Hebrew) accounted for 17 per cent of the dropout of phase 2 and 8 per cent of phase 3.

Twelve per cent of the dropouts refused to be interviewed in phase 2 and 18 per cent in phase 3. The other reasons for not being interviewed included being in the hospital, serving in the army, being abroad and having the interview interrupted and not completed.

The samples were drawn from Greater Tel Aviv, Jerusalem, Haifa and Beer Sheba. These sampled areas contain 60 per cent of the country's population.

The representativeness of the samples can be estimated by comparing the survey population with data from the Statistical Abstract of Israel, 1969. Sex, ethnic origin, education and year of immigration will be considered.

The survey population born in Asia and Africa is underrepresented because of the relatively lower proportion of this group in survey areas and the higher proportion of illiteracy and insufficient knowledge of Hebrew.

Explanations for under-representation of lower educated groups include a higher proportion of lower educated among newcome population born in Asia or Africa who are relatively less represented in surveyed urban areas and a higher degree of illiteracy among lower educated.

Explanations of underrepresentation of newcomers include the lower proportion of newcomers in the city areas surveyed, and the higher proportion of insufficient knowledge of Hebrew among newcomers.

In conclusion, it is obvious that the distribution of the samples in the three phases is very stable. Taking into account the shortcomings of available sources of comparison, the sample can be considered representative of the population.
